Honoring the fiftieth anniversary of the death of Louis Kahn in March 1974, this facsimile edition exquisitely reproduces the notebook in which the renowned American architect sketched and wrote during his travels in the last year of his life.

Anchored by a magnificent set of drawings illustrating the final design of the Franklin D. Roosevelt Four Freedoms Park in New York City (1973/74, posthumously completed in 2012), *Louis Kahn's Last Notebook* provides an intimate glimpse into the architect's mind and design process. These private sketches and poetic reflections reveal Kahn's spiritual understanding of architecture as inclusive of our total environment and shed new light on the architect's influential philosophy for designing, building and conceiving architecture.

The facsimile pays close attention to the material qualities of the original notebook, replicating its delicate, transparent paper. Made widely available for the first time, the publication includes transcriptions of Kahn's handwriting by Sue Ann Kahn and a commentary by architectural critic and historian Michael J. Lewis.

Continuing on from earlier investigations into the importance of drawing in the iconic architect's work at Lars Müller Publishers, *Louis Kahn's Last Notebook* replicates sketching in its most raw, pure form.



The cities of Rome and Las Vegas commonly sit at opposite ends of what architecture represents: whereas the former capital of the Roman Empire is perceived as ancient, proper and eternal, Sin City is described as flashy, vulgar and fake. Yet, both find themselves historically and contemporarily at the intersection of power and play.

Released fifty years after Denise Scott Brown and Robert Venturi's now canonical *Learning From Las Vegas* (1972), the images in this book capture the atmosphere of both cities from the sky to the ground, revealing unexpected similarities and rediscovering Las Vegas' extravaganza on the streets of Rome. Iwan Baan's photographs contrast and subvert common perceptions of authenticity and artificiality and ultimately question such bipolar distinctions. In their dialogue, the photographs follow Scott Brown and Venturi's plea to first look, understand and only then judge.

IWAN BAAN (*1975) is a Dutch photographer based between Amsterdam and the U.S., known primarily for images that narrate the life and interactions that occur within architecture. In 2012, he received the Golden Lion at the Venice Biennale for his work on the Torre David in Caracas, Venezuela, gaining him further international acclaim. Architects turn to Baan to give their work a sense of place.



This book acts as a bridge between the topics of energy and water. It is an artfully crafted visual ode which imagines and reflects upon the intricate bond between the people who count on dams for energy and water, and the source that fuels this bounty. It is a tribute to the engineering feat so grand that it made Switzerland an energy hub in demand, providing the life-sustaining flow that drives our modern world.

Candid and curious, this publication focuses on two things: the appearance and significance of the dam and power plant, and the appreciation of the structure as an impressive manifestation of civilization and culture in harmony with the spectacular nature and surroundings. With interviews and breathtaking photographs, this book delves into the history of the valley region and includes memories and opinions of those involved. Expert insights broaden the context and consider Emosson as an example of an intact symbiosis of nature and culture, and provide a glimpse of what is to come.

BEATRICE GORELLI is a graphic and media designer who graduated with a master's degree in media design from HEAD, Geneva, and a bachelor's degree in visual communication from SUPSI, Lugano. She currently works in advertising as an art director and 3D animator.

KEIICHI KITAYAMA first worked as a fashion and celebrity portrait photographer in Japan before moving to Berlin, where his work has featured in several fashion magazines such as *GQ*, *Schön* and *Teeth*. His 2015 photo book *Amou Hoje?* about his stay in Brazil was featured in the American art magazine *Juxtapoz* and *Lomography Magazine* among others. After his stay in Switzerland, he acquired an interest in nature photography with a focus on environmental issues.



Lorenz Boegli is the master of screen printing and he guards the secrets surrounding his recipes and processes like the tinkerers and inventors of old. By utilizing pearlescent pigments in his innovative RGB printing technique, his works come to possess visual and dimensional qualities unattainable by other printing processes. Boegli's craft is used by the crème de la crème of fashion, luxury and jewelry brands for their packaging and printed matter. Each commission leads him to develop his printing effects and techniques further; he astounds with emotional results that are only remotely reminiscent of traditional screen printing.

Boegli's products achieve their maximum effect in this publication in combination and juxtaposition with offset printing in equally high quality. Across eight exquisite types of papers, the printing effects used bring to life the various motifs from art, photography, fashion and jewelry, offering an incomparable visual and sensual spectacle. Text contributions in letterpress enhance the haptic sensation of the book. Experts from various disciplines shed light on the metaphor of alchemy in relation to Boegli's mastery and its significance for artistic and commercial use, as well as for the advancement of the printing industry.

The publication is produced in close cooperation between Lorenz Boegli, the quality printing house Grafiche Antiga – Tipoteca in Treviso and the traditional Italian paper manufacturer Fedrigoni.





Modern Man in the Making shows Neurath's democratic endeavor to make knowledge intelligible and available to all. It is a reminder of graphic art's ability to inform and create context instead of presenting aesthetic qualities only. The book has inspired generations of designers and led to sometimes peculiar imitations and further developments. This pivotal historical picture-text book is made available again as a reprint of the original publication in the series XX The Century of Print – at a time in which new media force designers ever more so to break down complex data into easily comprehensible depictions.

OTTO NEURATH (1882–1945) was an Austrian-born political economist, sociologist and philosopher of science. Throughout his life, Neurath pursued his political vision of a new, egalitarian world community, which he sought to promote through the development of a universally understandable presentation of information.

Joy and Fear is a continuation of Otto Neurath's 1939 book Modern Man in the Making. Joy and Fear questions how modernity, through its promises and its failures, continues to reshape mankind. The promises have been fulfilled, especially for people in the West: Hygiene, modern medicine and education have led to vast improvements in health, life expectancy and literacy rates throughout the West. For large parts of the world's population, however, these promises have not been fulfilled. For example, the current average life expectancy in Chad is equal to that of the United States in the 1920s, and at 52 is eight years below the retirement age there. The entire globe is unquestioningly and irreversibly involved in the modern project, but its benefits are very unevenly distributed.

By depicting these asymmetries, *Joy and Fear* brings clarity to today's modern world. The pictograms and illustrations and their accompanying texts touch on global issues ranging from agriculture to warfare to the welfare state. The visual language makes complex issues immediately accessible. Holding the various themes together is a coherent narrative.

In 1951, Le Corbusier (1887–1965) embarked on his first visit to the Indian state of Punjab in anticipation of the planning and construction of Chandigarh. He travelled lightly. Included in his luggage was a notebook, which he would use to record his first impressions of the local culture and environment and document his ideas for the modern city.


This reprint of Le Corbusier's *Album Punjab Simla*. *Chandigarh, Mars 1951* grants new insights into the everyday circumstances under which Le Corbusier, together with a close-knit group of architects, forged their masterplan for Chandigarh, a landmark of modern architecture which continues to fascinate architects, historians and architecture enthusiasts alike.

Made widely available for the first time, the spiralbound notebook has been transcribed, translated and contextualized. A paperback volume featuring previously unpublished photographs, taken by Le Corbusier's cousin Pierre Jeanneret during this early expedition, accompanies the facsimile, illustrating the landscape and people the architects encountered through a personal lens. A detailed commentary by architectural historian Maristella Casciato reflects on the variety of topics assembled in the notebook and provides a day-by-day account of the early days of the great modernist city.



From 1970 to 1973, Chile carried out a political experiment in which socialist change would occur peacefully and with respect for existing democratic institutions. This "Chilean road to socialism," as it was often called, offered a unique political third way at the height of the Cold War – one that broke from the opposing models put forth by the United States and the Soviet Union. This short and abruptly ended period in Chilean history resulted in product and communication design that powerfully demonstrates how design can influence social behavior and identity, and foster solidarity and cohesion.

How to Design a Revolution documents the Chilean visual language born out of exceptional circumstances. The publication broadens the study of influential and consequential visual languages of the social (protest) movements of the 1960s and 1970s, such as the Cuban Revolution, the Vietnam War and May 68, and illustrates how design came to reflect the dynamics of this political era while also becoming a tool for political change.

HUGO PALMAROLA is associate professor in the School of Design at the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile and holds a PhD in Latin American Studies from UNAM Mexico. Together with Pedro Alonso, he curated and edited *Flying Panels: How Concrete Panels Changed the World* at ArkDes Stockholm, and *Monolith Controversies: Pavilion of Chile* at the 14th Venice Architecture Rienniale.

EDEN MEDINA is a historian of science and technology and a professor in the MIT Program for Science, Technology and Society. She is the author of *Cybernetic Revolutionaries: Technology and Politics in Allende's Chile* and coeditor of *Beyond Imported Magic: Essays on Science, Technology, and Society in Latin America.*

PEDRO ALONSO is associate professor in the School of Architecture at the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile and head of the PhD Program in Architecture, Design and Urban Studies.

Mobility has always been integral to human experience. Despite its importance, mainstream discussions on the subject tend to reduce it to the movement of people and objects from one point to the next. Bodies are classified by category and incorporated into narratives that are invariably oriented toward a supposed norm, one that, in turn, can mostly be understood as a system of belonging or exclusion. Non-binary, queer, ill, disabled, old and Black bodies are strikingly underrepresented and only come into view when their depiction is motivated by the message. As much as generalizing is essential to quick communication, it is also dangerous. Power relations and norms with respect to gendered, racialized and non-normative bodies are continually upheld, adding legitimacy to their marginalization and discrimination.


Talking Bodies examines different mechanisms of representation of the body in media cultures – from stereotypical forms of gender representation to the persistence of the regime of the white gaze and to self-staging on social media – and situates them in a cultural, historical and sociological context. This publication brings together international posters from a wide range of categories, and reveals continuities as well as changes and deviations in the depiction of the human body. Unsettling and even provocative poster compositions provide food for thought and inspire the discovery of new visual dialogues.

BETTINA RICHTER (*1964) studied art history in Heidelberg, Paris and Zurich. From 1997 to 2006, she served as a research associate at the Poster Collection of the Museum für Gestaltung Zürich, and in 2006 became its curator. She is the editor of the publication series *Poster Collection* and has published articles and essays on art history, literature and the subject of posters.


Inspired by the humble surroundings of Ballenberg, *A Way of Life* is an invitation to discover and explore the world of objects with different eyes. Ballenberg is an open-air museum in the Bernese Oberland in the Swiss Alps, which brings together farmhouses from across the country spanning the fourteenth to the nineteenth centuries. This book, edited by the entrepreneur and long-time driving force behind Vitra, Rolf Fehlbaum, is the result of a trip there by designer Jasper Morrison and architects David Saik, Tsuyoshi Tane and Federica Zanco.

The authors share a fascination with simplicity, practicality and functional beauty of the material world in which rural populations lived. As Ballenberg reveals, architecture, furnishings and tools were always committed in their design and execution to the needs and necessities of everyday life; genuine solutions were found with the available means. A Way of Life contemplates this intrinsic relationship between design, form and function, and serves as a gentle reminder to resist the fads of today's consumer world.

The Book of Hours by the Mexican architect Frida Escobedo is a modern interpretation of an extinct devotional practice. Perhaps as ubiquitous as smartphones today, the books of hours were a private necessity in Europe during the Middle Ages. These illuminated manuscripts contained collections of texts that were meaningful to each owner, and offered a distinct method of structuring the day around prayer by marking the passing of the canonical hours. Sections of the books would be recited at regular intervals throughout the twenty-four hours of the day. In them, the public and the private timescales converged, crystallized into a highly personal object, full of beauty.

Escobedo's *Book of Hours* presents twenty-four objects photographed at different intervals of time to capture their evolution, making a new calendar of matter and light. As humanity has transitioned to a secular understanding of time in which hours are organized and conceived in terms of productivity, *The Book of Hours* interrogates the place of contemplation in our era, its possibility and necessity. Through this book – a public display of a private collection of objects – readers are invited to contemplate these arrays of matter and experience the ways in which they once interacted with light, that burning needle in time's template.

FRIDA ESCOBEDO (*1979) established her eponymous architectural studio in Mexico City in 2006. In 2022, she was appointed as the architect to design the new Modern & Contemporary Wing for The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City, becoming the youngest and first woman to design a building for the institution.
